OUR HOME

Marlborough is a special place for wine. Perhaps it's our cloudless skies or mild temperatures or well-drained soils. It could be our long growing season or our sustainably-farmed vineyards. Whatever the reason, the result is wines that are marked by piercingly vibrant fruit flavours and lively acidity.

PRESERVING OUR LAND

We have been tending vineyards and making wine in Marlborough for over twenty years. Our home is important to us, and we see our role as a caretaker of this part of the world. We strive to minimize or eliminate any activities that are wasteful or harmful to the environment so that future generations can continue to enjoy our extraordinary landscape.

OUR WINEMAKING

With every step of the winemaking process our goal is to preserve the incredible aromatics and scintillating structure of our wines. After harvesting, we keep the fruit as cool as possible to retain bright, fresh Marlborough fruit flavours. Gentle crushing helps to preserve the personality of the variety and the influence of the site. Our Pinot Gris is kept in stainless steel tanks to maintain zest fruit characteristics.

Off-dry in style, our 2013 Pinot Gris exudes fragrant aromas of apple, and nectarine, accented by a hint of citrus. Flavours mimic the bouquet and deliver textbook Marlborough minerality and a refreshing, crisp acidity.
